Resources for Finding a Career: Educator Guide

Goal: Students will complete an Intelligences assessment in order to learn about careers that fit their interests and skills.

Recommended Preparation

 Review the Student Worksheet. The worksheet provides clear instructions for students to complete the lesson. Determine how you will use the worksheet.

Getting Started

 You may print the Student Worksheet for students or embed the link in the materials you share with students.

Guiding Question

How can you begin honing the skills you need for your career during your remaining time in high school?

Bell Work (15-20 minutes)

 Students will sign in to CaliforniaColleges.edu, navigate to the Intelligences assessment, and complete the assessment.

Introduction (10 minutes)

 Students will review their results and both explain and reflect on their intelligence profiles with an elbow partner.

Activity (20 minutes)

- 1. Students will identify five careers from their results that interest them.

Reflection (5-10 minutes)

- Direct students to My Journal to respond to the prompt indicated in the student worksheet (prompt #07: "What is your intelligence profile? What careers are a good match for your skills? Identify and describe one way you can strengthen a skill this year to help you meet your career goals."). You may also assign an alternative prompt.
- Optional: direct students to upload their completed worksheet to My Documents, found under My Plan.





Resources for Finding a Career: Student Worksheet

Goal: You will complete an Intelligences assessment in order to learn about careers that match your interests and skills.

Part I: Introduction – Bell Work

- Sign in to CaliforniaColleges.edu.
- Hover on **Career** at the top of the page and click on **Intelligences**.
- Complete the assessment.

Part II: Activity

- 1. Take a few minutes to read your results in the **Intelligences and You** section. Next, click on the tabs of your top three intelligences and read about them.
- 2. Describe your intelligence profile (results) to an elbow partner. Consider: What do your results mean? What are your strengths?
- 3. Scroll down to the **Career and Pathways** section. Write down five careers that sound interesting to you here:

- 4. From the **Career and Pathways** section, click on the career that interests you most so you can learn more about it. This will take you to the career factsheet. Review the **Skills** section of the factsheet (you will need to scroll to the bottom of the page to see this section).
- 5. Reflect on the skills you see listed. Are these skills you already have? Skills you want to develop? How can you develop the skills you need? If you agree the career may be a good fit, favorite it by clicking on the at the very top of the page; it will save to your My Plan. If you are unsure about the career, check out the **Related Careers** and review the factsheets of other careers. Favorite those you like.
- 6. Repeat steps #4 and #5 for all five careers that you selected.

Part III: Reflect

- Go to My Plan and then My Journal. In the Career Journal section, find prompt #07:
 "What is your intelligence profile? What careers are a good match for your skills? Identify and describe one way you can strengthen a skill this year to help you meet your career goals."
- Respond to the above prompt. Follow your teacher's instructions if they assign a different prompt.
