Goal: Students will evaluate their personal interests and explore matching career options in order to identify potential career paths that align with their interests and strengths.

# What Do I Like?: Interest Profiler: Educator Guide

Goal: Students will evaluate their personal interests and explore matching career options in order to identify potential career paths that align with their interests and strengths.

### **Recommended Preparation**

 Review the **Student Worksheet**. The worksheet provides clear instructions for students to complete the lesson. Determine how you will use the worksheet.

### **Getting Started**

 You may print the Student Worksheet for students or embed the link in the materials you share with students.

### **Guiding Question**

How can our interests help us choose a career?

#### **Bell Work (5 minutes)**

- Students will answer the bell work question: "What do I like to study at school? What do I like to do
  outside of school?"
- Allow 2-3 timed minutes past the bell for this work.

#### Introduction (20-30 minutes)

- Students should sign in to the platform and take the Interest Profiler assessment.
  - If you have students who will benefit from completing the paper version Interest Profiler, click here. Please note, those results cannot be uploaded to CaliforniaColleges.edu.
- Students can review their results with a partner.

#### Activity (30 minutes)

- 1. Students will use the platform to search careers based on their results.
- 2. Within career factsheets, students will examine the relationship between their interests and the education required for each career.
- 3. Students will choose their favorite careers, save them to My Career Plan, and review their lists.

# Reflection (5-10 minutes)

- Direct students to **My Journal** to respond to the prompt indicated in the student worksheet (*prompt #10: "Why is it important to choose a career that aligns to your interests?"*). You may also assign an alternative prompt.
- Optional: direct students to upload their completed worksheet to My Documents, found under My Plan.





# What Do I Like?: Interest Profiler: Student Worksheet

Goal: You will evaluate your personal interests and explore matching career options in order to identify potential career paths that align with their interests and strengths.

### Part I: Introduction – Bell Work

What do I like to study at school? What do I like to do outside of school?

#### Now.

- Sign in to CaliforniaColleges.edu.
- Hover on Career at the top of the page, and then click on Interest Profiler.
- Complete the assessment.
- Review your results.

### **Part II: Activity**

- 1. Your **Interest Profiler** results will include careers that may interest you. Explore these careers by clicking on the career titles. Review the entire factsheet for each career, paying special attention to related careers and what to study.
- 2. When you find careers you may like ♥ (favorite) them and they will be saved in the career section of your My Plan.
- 3. You may also conduct a more general career search using the **Career Search Tool**. Navigate to **Career and then to Career Search Tool**.
- 4. Search careers by keyword, Bright Outlook, or Industry. Try a search using each of these filters.
- 5. Again, when you find careers you may like, (favorite) them.
- 6. When you have finished researching careers, review your careers. To do this, select **My Plan** at the top of the page, then **My Career Plan**, and look at your career list.

#### Part III: Reflect

- Go to **My Plan** and then **My Journal**. In the **Career Journal** section, find **prompt #10**: "Why is it important to choose a career that aligns to your interests?"
- Respond to the above prompt. Follow your teacher's instructions if they assign a different prompt.
