



## Past and Future Me: Career Investigation (9.3)

# Goal: Students will complete a career assessment in order to find careers that align with their interests.

#### **Lesson Time Options**

This lesson is part of the Past and Future Me Series (Lessons 9.3 - 9.5) and will require one 45-60 minute class period. The series requires a total of approximately three 45-60 minute class periods. (Note that 9.4 is an academic planning lesson that should be conducted by counselors and may take longer than 60 minutes, depending on the group of students.)

### Past and Future Me: Career Investigation: Educator Guide

## Goal: Students will complete a career assessment in order to find careers that align with their interests.

#### **Recommended Preparation**

Review the Student Worksheets for all lessons in the series (9.3 – 9.5). The worksheets provide clear instructions for students to complete the lesson. Determine how you will use the worksheets.

#### **Getting Started**

 You may print the Student Worksheet for students or embed the link in the materials you share with students.

#### **Guiding Question**

What type of career do you see yourself pursuing and how can you make decisions in high school that will help you get there?

#### **Bell Work (5 minutes)**

- Students will answer these bell work questions: What do I like to do in school? What do I like to do
  outside of school?
- Allow 2-3 timed minutes past the bell.

#### Introduction (15-30 minutes)

- Students will sign into CaliforniaColleges.edu and take the Interest Profiler assessment.
  - If you have students who will benefit from completing the paper version Interest Profiler, click <u>here</u>. Please note that paper results cannot be uploaded to CaliforniaColleges.edu.
- Students will review their results with a partner.

#### Activity (30 minutes)

- 1. Students will use CaliforniaColleges.edu to search for careers based on their results.
- 2. Within the career factsheets, students will examine the correlation between their interests and the education required for each career.
- 3. Students will choose their favorite careers and save them to their **My Plan**. Students will fill out the chart on their worksheet with the information they have learned.

#### **Reflection (5-10 minutes)**

- Direct students to My Journal to respond to the prompt indicated in the student worksheet (prompt #09: "What progress have you made towards your college and career goals during your first year of high school? Did you make any decisions you regret? Did you make any decisions you were especially proud of?"). You may also assign an alternative prompt.
- Optional: direct students to upload their completed worksheet to My Documents, found under My Plan.

Goal: You will complete a career assessment in order to find careers that align with your interests.

#### Part I: Introduction – Bell Work

What do I like to do in school? What do I like to do outside of school?

#### Now,

- Sign in to **CaliforniaColleges.edu**.
- Navigate to Career and then to Interest Profiler.
- Complete the assessment.
- Review your results.

#### **Part II: Activity**

- 1. Your Interest Profiler results will include careers that may interest you. Explore these careers by clicking on the career titles. Review the entire factsheet for each career, paying special attention to related careers and what to study.
- 2. When you find careers you may like, (favorite) them, and they will be saved in the career section of your **My Plan**.
- 3. You may also conduct a more general career search using the **Career Search Tool**. Navigate to **Career** and then to **Career Search Tool**.
- 4. Search careers by keyword, Bright Outlook, or Industry. Try a search using each of these filters.
- 5. Again, when you find careers you may like, (favorite) them.
- 6. When you have finished researching careers, review your careers. To do this, select **My Plan** at the top of the page, then **My Career Plan** and look at your career list.
- 7. Given your preferred careers, use the worksheet below to reflect on the connection between your career interests, related college requirements, and what you can do in high school to eventually secure a career that interests you. Complete the chart for two of your career choices.

Career Goal	Related College Goal	High School Step
Example: Become veterinarian	Attend UC Davis and earn my undergraduate degree, and then I will need another degree.	1. Take honors science classes 2. Earn a 3.8 or higher GPA 3. Volunteer at the SPCA for 40 hours

#### Part III: Reflect
